In 1940 he was made a director of the Deacon Brothers company.

Walter Aselstine was a close friend of Hinchey's. By no coincidence, Aselstine was also a well-known local musician.

Hinchey died unexpectedly of a heart attack Oct. 5, 1952, at 66. The list of friends from musical and military outfits who attended his funeral included many from outside the city, some who had travelled great distances to say goodbye to their old comrade.

The last line in The Ontario Intelligencer's story on the funeral and final tribute to Hinchey, held at Christ Church, reads, "May the kindly earth rest gently on the mortal remains of Reg Hinchey, a good soldier and good friend."
