











BURLINGTON'S BIG P.S... "STILL GROWING!"

Burlington's exceptionally rapid growth makes it virtually impossible to present, in a brochure of this type, a completely up-to-date picture of the area's total-living environment. Almost before the ink is dry, new advances in cultural, educational and recreation facilities are taking shape on the architects' drawing boards. Hence this "P.S." page with some examples of the more recent additions to Burlington's "good-living" bonus. In total, they represent an impressive echo from the tempo of Burlington's industrial expansion . . . A record of progress evidenced by commercial, industrial and educational building permits totalling over \$7,750,000 for the first eight months of 1968.

- 1. The Burlington Mall—A vast 60-store shopping community in one climate-controlled building. Lessees include Department Stores, Super Markets, Specialty Shops, Banks, Theatre, Restaurants etc. as well as such services as cleaners, optometrist, travel agency etc.
- 2. The Federal Government's Great Lakes anti-pollution research program is centred in this new laboratory complex.
- 3. Burlington's new Central Recreation Centre, a leisure-time complex that includes an arena, auditorium-banquet hall, club rooms, snack bars etc.
- 4. The new General Brock High School is one of four new school buildings to be completed in 1968.
- 5. The new Calvary Baptist Church—one of the three new churches completed this year.
- 6. Many new industrial structures too including this million-dollar-plus plant of British-Leyland Motors Canada Ltd.
