A Fine Fighting Family

It may seem invidious to single out for special mention the fighting record of any one Canadian family, but that of the family of Mr. and Mrs. Scott Griffin, well-known residents of this city, seems to merit it. Their eldest son, Gilbert, who is home on leave after one and a half years' service with the overseas army, is a captain in the 48th Highlanders. Their second son, William, is a flight lieutenant in the Royal Air Force who was present at Dunkirk and has seen almost continuous active service. Their third son, Tony, a lieutenant in the Royal Canadian Navy, was recently appointed to the command of a corvette. being the first member of the R.C.N.V.R. to gain such a promotion, and was also mentioned in despatches for his coolness and daring; and their fourth son, Peter, after two and a half years' service in Britain with the army, has recently returned to this continent to train with a Canadian paratroop unit in Georgia.

A contribution of four gallant young officers by one family to the fighting forces will be difficult to match in any country; and it is interesting to recall that they are grandsons of Sir William Mackenzie, the great railway builder.
