12 Sabre Jets Due To Fly Low Over City

Twelve Sabre jets of 413 Squadron of the R.C.A.F. will be flying over Peterborough at 1:10 p.m. Tuesday if the weather permits. However, rain is forecast for Tuesday.

Among the pilots whose home base is Bagotville, Que., are a Bobcaygeon man, FO Murray E. Kelly, 24, and FO. T. V. Mulrooney, 28, of Kingston.

The squadron is making a tour of Ontario centres, staging flying demonstrations to give Ontario people who have never seen a jet flying a view of the operational aircraft.

670 Miles An Hour.

The aircraft fly at a top speed of about 670 miles an hour and are now being used in aerial fighting in Korea and are flown by Canada's squadron in Europe.

They carry six .50 calibre machine guns in their nose and are used for low flying strafing of troops or high altitude fighting. In Korea they have chalked up a worthy record in spite of fighting against the very good Russian MIG fighter.

As well as visiting Peterborough Tuesday, they will fly over Oshawa and Hamilton. Wednesday morning, they are scheduled to be on view over Orillia and Barrie.

The same day at noon they will be over St. Catharines and Niagara Falls, and then to Brantford, Galt, Preston, Kitchener and Guelph Thursday.

Friday morning the squadron will cruise around Stratford and St. Thomas and leave Malton airport Saturday for Bracebridge and North Bay. A fly past is scheduled for Sudbury Saturday morning with Huntsville and Midland listed for Sunday morning.

Next Monday the squadron will return to Bagotville, Que.
