

CANADA PARATROOPS GO TO SHILO SOON

Get Badges as They Near
End of Training in
Georgia

LAUDED BY U.S.

Fort Benning, Ga., March 9—(CP)—A group of Canadian paratroopers, their newly earned qualifying badges gleaming on their breasts, looked forward today to going to Camp Shilo, Man. They have nearly completed their training period at this United States army base.

The Canadians marked the approaching end of training here yesterday with a march past American and Canadian armies, and a mass jump, staged by 36 of the Dominion's sky soldiers. The commanding general of Fort Benning, Brig.-Gen. Walter S. Fulton, told them that "it is thrilling to know that so fine a body of men is an ally of ours in this struggle against tyranny."

Brig.-Gen. George P. Howell, commander of the parachute school, pinned the badges on the most recent class of Canadian graduates, who will now have a part in the work at parachute troop training school at Shilo. With Gen. Fulton and Gen. Howell at the march past were Brig. A. E. Nash, deputy adjutant-general of the Canadian army, and Lt.-Col. W. B. Webb, Canadian military attache at Washington.
