

Giant German Stuka Captured Intact In Africa



Predicting that the Luftwaffe will be the first German military arm to crack up completely, Air Chief Marshal Sir Arthur Tedder, commander of Allied forces in North Africa, says that a total of 525 planes have been captured in Tunisia, many of them in excellent condition.
