born 11 Feb 1897 in Coboconk, Roman Catholic, son of William Angiers & Rose [Reese]. **Killed in Action** July 21 1918, buried Pas de Calais France. **Served WW1** Pte 109th Overseas Batt'n, 726136, enlisted Coboconk. See attestation paper. 109th was split up overseas, and was in 38th Btt'n Eastern Ont Reg't, Infantry.

DECLARATION TO BE MADE BY MAN ON ATTESTATION.

Patrick Herbert Angiers do solemnly declare that the above are answers made by me to the above questions and that they are true, and that I am willing to fulfil the engagements by me now made, and I hereby engage and agree to serve in the Canadian Over-Seas Expeditionary Force, and to be attached to any arm of the service therein, for the term of one year, or during the war now existing between Great Britain and Germany should that war last longer than one year, and for six months after the termination of that war provided His Majesty should so long require my services, or until legally discharged.

OATH TO BE TAKEN BY MAN ON ATTESTATION.

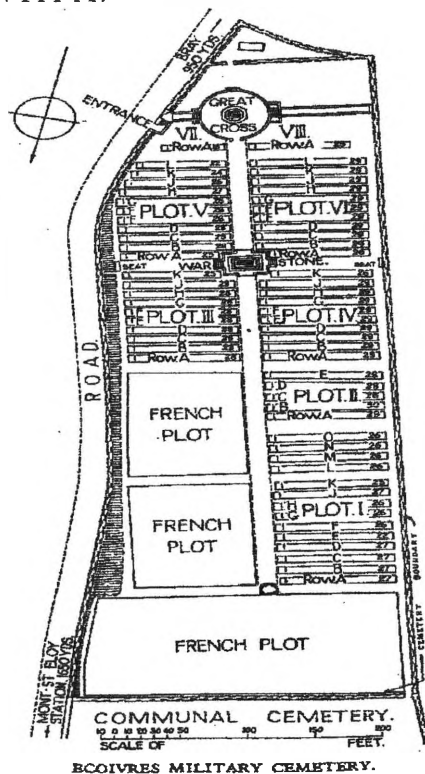
CERTIFICATE OF MAGISTRATE.

Mont St Eloi is a village in the Department of the Pas-de-Calais, 8 kilometres north-west of Arras. The village stands on high ground overlooking the battlefields of Vimy and Souchez and the main Bethune-Arras road, and the ruined towers that rise from it were used as an observation post during the French attacks at Neuville-St Vaast and Givenchy in May 1915. Ecoivres is a hamlet lying at the foot of the hill, to the south-west and about 1.5 kilometres from Mont St Eloi on the Arras-St Pol line. The ECOIVRES MILITARY CEMETERY is on the D49 road.
