I am writing this to the people of Lindsay as I want them to know how wonderful the Canadian Red Cross has been to us in hospital here. I could not help sitting down and writing this line to you to tell you how well the boys are looked after by the Red Cross.

There is nothing we want that they don't get for us. I have been in hospital nearly ten weeks, and there has not been a day that I have not seen them, except Sun-

days.

We are getting your sweaters and socks and cigarettes and appreciate these very much.
