Word has just been received at Oakwood of the wounding of Sgt. Jarvis Lake, while serving during the conquest of Germany. Sgt. Lake is the son of Mrs. E. M. and the late Marshall Lake, former residents of the village, at present residing in Toronto.

While full details of his injuries are not immediately available, it is known that he is suffering from severe injuries to his left knee and left arm. His wounds are reported to have been caused by shell fragments.

Sgt. Lake was born at Oakwood, and it was here he received his early edcuation. Previous to the outbreak of war he was employed as a miner and it was from this work that he went to join His Majesty's Forces, at Lindsay. He enlisted with the Midland Regiment (Active) and has been overseas for some months.

During his service, he was in Italy during the heavy stages of the fighting there and later returned to England, where he was given a special training course and sent to the Western Front, where he was wounded.

Sgt. Lake's friends all sincerely hope that his wounds may be of less severity than at first anticipated.
