

MRS. WM. MARSHALL GETS 1st LETTER FROM HER SON HOWARD, PRISONER OF WAR

**"I WILL BE SEEING YOU ALL AGAIN," SAYS
RIFLEMAN MARSHALL IN LETTER WRITTEN
LAST MARCH.**

Welcome news has come to another Lindsay home in the form of a letter from a son, who has been a prisoner of war in Hong Kong, since Christmas Day, 1941.

Mrs. Wm. Marshall, Kent St. E., has just received the first communication from her son, Howard, since that fateful day, nearly two years ago.

Mrs. P. S. Nugent, also of town, whose son Bill was taken prisoner at the same time has had two letters, one last Fall and another about two weeks ago.

Howard Marshall enlisted 3 years ago on Oct. 3 and after training at Ottawa, St. John, Nwfd. and Niagara was sent to Hong Kong, as a Royal Rifleman in the 1st Midland Reg't.

A brother, Orville, is also in the 1st Midland Reg't Overseas, having enlisted on Oct. 9, three years ago.

Another brother, George is on the Alaska Highway. Besides his father and mother in town, he has three sisters here.

The letter written on March 8th of this year, reads:

Dear Mother,—

Just a few lines to let you know that I am well and hope the folks at home are the same. Write in care of the Geneva Red Cross.

I will be seeing you all again.

Will say "Good-Bye" for now,
