At Dieppe—Ceremony In Long
Branch United Church.**

Banks of colourful summer flowers, and white tapers formed a pretty setting in Long Branch United Church on Thursday, August 2nd, for the marriage of Margaret Evelyn Johnstone, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Johnstone, of Winnipeg, to Spr. Jack E. Wright, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Wright, Long Branch. Rev. C. J. McKay officiated, assisted by Rev. J. A. Lousley. Mr. A. B. Smith played the wedding music, and Miss Joyce Wright sang "Because" and "The Lord's Prayer".
