

Reported Missing For Three Months, Official Word Received of Capture by Germans.

Haliburton, April 26 (Staff)—Mr. and Mrs. G. M. Yarnold have received official word that their son, W. O. 1. Oscar Pearson Yarnold, is now a prisoner of war in Germany after being reported missing for three months, and the family and friends were greatly relieved of long weeks of anxiety when a letter was received over the week-end from their son saying he was uninjured and in the best of health and he was in a transit camp. W. O. Yarnold has been missing since Jan. 22, when they failed to return from a raid over Magdeburg, Germany.

He has two brothers in the R.C. A.F., Cpl. Robt. B. Yarnold, of Pearce, Alberta, and A C 1 Grant McLean Yarnold of Belleville; two sisters, Miss Betty Yarnold at home, Mrs. Jean Steed of Toronto, whose husband, Cpl. J. W. Steed, is in Italy.

Before enlisting W. O. Oscar Yarnold was associated with the John Welch & Son funeral directors at Minden and left one year ago for overseas, after advanced training at Chatham, N.B.
