Just a few lines to let you know I am on the way home. I have just arrived from Germany by air. We were liberated May 2nd from a camp near Nurenberg, east of the Elbe. Expect to go to England to-day or to-morrow. I will likely home before you receive official notice that I'm O.K. Prisoners of War are coming in very fast. I had a look around part of Brussels yesterday and visited various Canadian Clubs. Everything is well organized and we are

well looked after. Well, there isn't much more to tell you until I get home. I will cable from England as soon as I arrive there. Hope this finds everyone at home O.K. and I will be seeing you all soon. Oscar P. Yarnold.
