

Ex - Prisoner Of Germans Coming Home

Haliburton, (PNS)—The following letter received by Mr. and Mrs. G. M. Yarnold from their son, W.O. Oscar Pearson Yarnold, ex-P.O.W. is the first that has been received since he wrote Nov. 9th, 1944. It may be a source of comfort to those who have not heard from their sons in Prisoner of War camps for several months.

This letter was dated Brussels, Belgium, May 5th, 1945 and reads as follows:

Dear Mom and Dad:—

Just a few lines to let you know I am on the way home. I have just arrived from Germany by air. We were liberated May 2nd from a camp near Nurenberg, east of the Elbe. Expect to go to England to-day or to-morrow. I will likely be home before you receive official notice that I'm O.K. Prisoners of War are coming in very fast. I had a look around part of Brussels yesterday and visited various Canadian Clubs. Everything is well organized and we are

well looked after. Well, there isn't much more to tell you until I get home. I will cable from England as soon as I arrive there. Hope this finds everyone at home O.K. and I will be seeing you all soon.
