

Former U.S. Marine Commander Purchases Pleasant Point Inn

"I like Canada and Canadians and for some time past I wanted to establish a business unit if the evening unit could on Pleasant Point", said William E. Brady, the new proprietor of the long-established Inn at Pleasant Point, Sturgeon Lake told "The Post".

Mr. Brady purchased the Inn from W. Christmas who has concluded a successful operation for several years past, especially during the last two years when he enjoyed the patronage of many U.S. visitors. Mr. Christmas has purchased a new lodge and cabin set up on Buckhorn Lake.

The new proprietor of Pleasant Point Inn comes from Somerville, New Jersey and for a number of years as a boy he enjoyed active life on a farm. This is one reason for his recent purchase of the John Curtin farm, which is located on Highway 35 opposite the Bonfire Bar-b-Que restaurant. "I wanted year-round occupation so I will operate the Inn all summer and

in the winter I will take care of the farm. I will have a number of cattle to look after" said Mr. Brady.

Mr. Brady had a spectacular career in the US merchant marine during the last war and served in every theatre of war, emerging as a full Commander. He anticipates the prospect of linking with the Canadian Legion branch in Lindsay. He has a wife and two children. The Inn has accommodation for upwards of forty plus the accomodation offered in a number of motel units.
