

Many Lindsay residents read with regret of the passing of Rev. Stanley M. Scott, formerly of Lindsay which took place at Kincardine. As a young man the late S. M. Scott entered the law firm of the late Thomas Stewart as a partner. Following the death of Mr. Stewart, the young barrister entered the law firm of Moore, Bradford and Scott and later on the firm became known as Bradford and Scott. Always having inclinations and ambitions to become a preacher of the gospel, the deceased resigned as a barrister to become a clergyman and followed through his early training in the Presbyterian faith.

In his capacity as a clergyman the late Mr Scott served faithfully and well at different charges. The late S. M. Scott served his King and Country as a member of the Royal Canadian Navy. Fraternally he was a faithful and ardent member and a past County Master of

the Loyal Orange Order and as a community-minded citizen he rendered service with the Lindsay Kiwanis Club. He was also a member of the Masonic Lodge and superintendent at St. Andrew's Sunday School in earlier years.

The late Rev. S. M. Scott married a former Lindsay girl, Miss Vera Mercer, R.N., and the late H. V. Mercer, druggist of Lindsay was a brother-in-law.
