Many years ago a young drug store clerk, Alfred Roberts, left his home on Fair Avenue, Lindsay, to seek his fortune in New York. The funeral of this gentleman takes place from the Mackey Funeral Parlours Tuesday, death taking place in his ninety-third year.

The late Alfred Roberts is remembered by a few residents of Lindsay. He was at an early age one of the best bass soloists ever to grace the Choir of Cambridge Street Methodist Church and during his years spent in New York his ability was appreciated as he was for many years soloist in Old Trinity Church. He was a soloist at many other events and functions. While in New York he was associated

with the drug business with different reputable firms. The drug business was taken up as an occupation when Ald. Roberts was in the Lindsay store of the late A. Higginbotham which at the time was located where the Zeller store is now situated. Later this drug store was for years located where the Harrigan store is situated today. The late Mr. Roberts was a life member of the old Cambridge Street Methodist Church. He was a member of the Masonic Order.

The late Mr. Roberts was a son of Mr. and Mrs. George Roberts and the latter was in the employment of the firm of Dundas and Flavelle.

Among the relatives surviving are Mrs. Arthur Leach of Victoria Ave., North in Lindsay; the latter's sister Mrs.

H. C. Hamilton, of Toronto, Mr. Hamilton having been for many years Organist and Choir-master in St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church. W. (Bill) Garnet, of the U.S.A. is also a relative and he is a brother of Mrs. Hamilton and Mr Leach.

Interment will take place in Riverside Cemetery on Tuesday.
