E. Gavin Koyn, a graduate of the old Lindsay Collegiate Institute, war veteran and successful business man passed away at his home in Fort Lauderdale, Fla. Interment took place in Riverside Cemetery, Lindsay on Tuesday. A number of mourners from out of town and several Lindsay friends attended the funeral service held in the Mackey chapel.

The late Gavin Koyn left Lindsay while in his teens and resided in Saskatoon, Sask.,

where his older brother Leon Koyn of Lindsay hockey fame, was engaged in a successful Real Estate business. As the years went by, the late Gavin Koyn became identified with the International Filter Company and his career in the business world took him to Chicago, Minneapolis, and other U.S. cities.

In his later years he moved to Florida, locating in Fort Lauderdale where he carried on a successful business as a Manufacturer's Agent.

The late Gavin Koyn saw service in France with the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry.

In his younger days in Saskatoon the late Gavin Koyn followed in the footsteps of his brother Leon Koyn as a hockey player. Brother Leon, a mem-



ber of the Lindsay Intermediate Ontario Hockey champions in 1908-09, is now a resident of Victoria, B.C. The late E. Gavin Koyn was predeceased by his wife two years ago.

The deceased gentleman was a son of the late Rev. Mr. Koyn, who passed away many years ago. His mother, Mrs. Koyn was a resident of Lindsay and lived on Bond Street, immediately west of the Cambridge Street Church.

The late E. Gavin Koyn is also survived by one sister Mariel (Mrs. Frederick Wellington) of Toronto.
