Memory Tests: Remember when the Conductor on the north line was a man named Greaves; another was a man named Kelly, and there was also Dinny Gall and a big tall chap named Tompson.

Remember when John Short was Chief Constable and his assistant a man named Parkes?

Remember when Stewart Wilkinson was a Conductor on the Grand Trunk Toronto-Montreal line and was acclaimed because he was very considerate and obliging to passengers? He was a son of a former railway engineer and ex-Mayor Thos. Wilkinson.

Remember when there were seven drug stores on Kent Street, namely Phil. Morgan, Andy Higinbotham, Billy Dunoon, Ed Gregory, Harold Mercer, Lloyd Reeves and Harold Rogers a druggist on the south side of the street in the Pulver store of today.

Remember when D. C. Trew was in charge of the library at the Grand Trunk Station, and when the Public Library was above the Dominion Bank?

Remember when Frank Dennison, a tinsmith, made the Dennison fish bait which was very popular with American fishermen?

Remember when there were three very talented women teachers in the east ward school?—Miss Alice Fanning, Miss Twamley and Miss Margaret Fee. One of the esteemed principals was D. A. Sommerville, and an equally fine principal was John Staples. Another popular principal at the north ward school was a gentleman named Trask, and one named Colin Smith.

Hard working princpals in the Central School included Sam. Armour and Duncan Mc-Dougal, followed by a teacher named Black. One of the most beloved lady teachers was Miss Ward. Other teachers who were admired included Miss Mable Graham, Miss "Banty" Wray, Miss Margaret Fee, and Miss Twamley.

Recognized as a very capable teacher at the Boys' Separate school was John Rogers.

One of the ablest teachers at Oakwood was G. B. Rennie and at Woodville the princpal was Murray Smith.

Jim Wood will be remembered by many pupils who attended the east ward and the north ward schools.

Miss Cassie Haugh was a popular teacher at the South Ward School.

Popular School Inspectors in bygone days included J. A. Knight, Gideon Broderick and R. F. Downey.
