The artistically designed pair of cuff links sent to the writer are actually a product of a mine (abandoned) at Crystal Lake just across the county line in Peterboro County. It is a combination of feldspar and quartz often known as "graphic granite" because the small interspersed pieces of quartz look like ancient cunei-

form writing. Members of the local club have been quite interested in feldspar, which in this case is labradorite, so-called because of being first

found in Labrador. The blue colour is not an intrinsic part of the mineral, but is due to the refraction of light among the twinned crystals of the labradorite.
