Charles R. Conquergood, who passed away recently in a Brampton nursing home was one of Lindsay's and Toronto's most prominent and successful businessmen.

He was the son of the late Porteous Conguergood and obtained his high school education at the Lindsay Collegiate Institute. When he was a young man, he worked his way up from a tradesman to president of the Canada Ink Company. During his career, he received many national and international awards in the manufacturing of inks, and he became a master in manufacturing inks of a wide variety of colors. He wrote many pamphlets and delivered hundreds of addresses on color.

As a Kiwanian, he was a past president of the Toronto Royal York Club and was installed in that position by

Past Governor Ivan Moore. He delivered over 24 addresses to the Lindsay Kiwanis Club and never gave the same talk twice. Several years ago he was made an honorary member of the Lindsay Club.

The late Charles Conquergood was for several years a past president of the Toronto board of education and a member of a provincial com-

mittee on education which toured the country studying education. He was a devout member of Eglinton United Church and for many years was a trustee of Trinity Church at Thurstonia where he resided for many summers.
