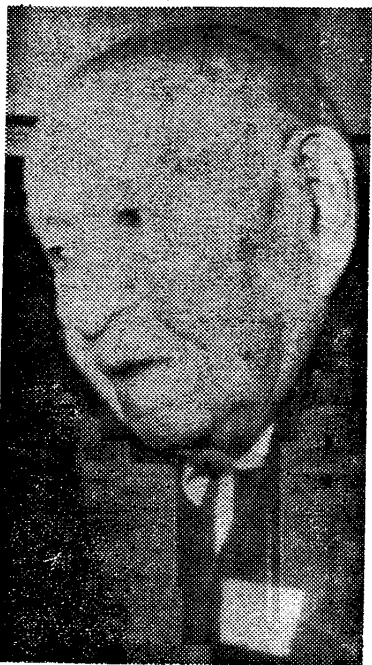


Moses Marsden dies at 104

Moses Marsden, one of the oldest residents of Peterborough County died Tuesday in Peterborough at the age of 104.

A Mississauga Indian and former chief of the Alderville Indian reserve (1903—1910), where he was born, Mr. Marsden was a resident of Balmoral Lodge and had lived in Lakefield for the past 46 years.

Funeral service is on Friday at 3 p.m. from the Comstock Funeral Home. Elder Philip Moores of the Seventh Day Adventist College in Oshawa will officiate.

A master builder of log cabins, Mr. Marsden retired from his trade only a few years ago. He served overseas with the 139th Battalion from 1914 to 1918.

Mrs. Marsden, the former Nellie Franklin, died in 1958. They had 13 children.

A few years ago Mr. Marsden attended a banquet in his honor at Minden and presented a miniature log cabin to the Haliburton Highlands Chamber of Commerce. The model can be seen in the Chamber office in Minden.
