

Fantabulous. This is a coined word which describes the transformation which has taken place at the Peel Street curling rink. In plain English the change has been fantastic. In the pitch black darkness of the night the new front lights up like the illumination at Niagara Falls, in many colors.

Interior renovations have changed the former dark dismal, drab aspect of the past into two luxurious lounges, accentuated by lavish splendor.

The old center door on the south wall has been moved to the south-east corner of the building and as one shoves open the swing doors and enters the main floor, he, or she, treads on colorful broadloom and what was formerly an incandescent lighted room is now illuminated by larger and better lights.

The food booth has been enlarged and refurnished and a long, wide wooden platform runs along the south wall and here patrons will be served in true restaurant style.

A long row of leather cushioned seats furnish an excellent view of the ice area with colorful rings in evidence.

The stairway to the Ladies' Club has been changed for the better. The newly carpeted room, improved lighting and lovely pannelled walls add to the comfort and appearance of the room. A complete new washroom has also been installed.

Male members will find an atmosphere of luxury and comfort in the top lounge. The cumbersome old bar has been removed from the north wall and a handsome refreshment bar has been placed at the east end, formerly the kitchen.

A thick pile rug covers the floor at the east end of the room and a shining hardwood floor has been installed at the west end, a splendid dance floor. The furnishing has also been improved and excellent accommodation has been arranged for spectators behind the glass where all parts of the ice surface can be observed.

On the whole the Lindsay Club has now one of the finest curling rinks in the province.
