The gathering of members of A.F. and A.M. was attended by a delegation from Fenelon Falls and other Victoria County lodges accompanied by District Grand Master Ivan Rodd and Mrs. Rodd of Lindsay.

The event was International Masonic Day and Fenelon Falls delegates were guests of Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Green of Brecksville, Ohio, who are summer residents in Somerville township.

Making the 400 mile trip by chartered coach were 21 Masons representing eight lodges in Victoria County, and their wives. They were warmly welcomed by their hosts Mr. and Mrs. Green who were assisted

by Mr. and Mrs. Beckett.

During their stay in Cleveland, the delegation attended a noon luncheon on Saturday and in the afternoon they observed degrees exemplified by RCMP officers from six Canadian provinces at the Cleveland Masonic Temple.

The group travelled to Brecksville, 12 miles south of Cleveland, for a buffet luncheon and a tour of the city Saturday evening and returned to the City Auditorium in Cleveland for evening entertainment.

The Grand Master's reception Friday night was a gala event attended by 2,000 Masons and their wives, as a preliminary to the two-day gathering.

The object of the event was to further cement American-Canadian Masonic fellowship.
