

Mrs. (Nesbitt) Clemet

Mrs Howard (Nesbitt) Clemet passed away during the Christmas-New Year week, at Beamsville Manor.

She is survived by her two children, Lyness, a retired member of the Canadian Air Force, residing in Montreal and Mrs. Harry Jean Braden of Hamilton.

The late Mrs. Clemet was the daughter of the late Rev. W. B. Secombe, a minister of the United Church, who was stationed at many churches in the Bay of Quinte Conference. She was remembered in Lindsay, as the wife of Dr. Howard A. Nesbitt, who practiced dentistry in Lindsay for a number of years.

A graduate of Whitby Ladies' College, she was a member of the teaching staff; a member and contralto soloist, in Cambridge Street United Church, president of the Women's Auxiliary and an officer in the Missionary unit.
