HOUSTON - A BIG CLUB MAKES A SMALL WORLD

President-designate Bruce Faulkner reported briefly on the International Convention and promises more details later. All delegates were met with a big sign "HOWDY Y'ALL". Fellowship was excellent, and Canadians especially popular. Lindsay's contribution received good recognition at a Friendship Meeting of some 100 delegates drawn from all over the world. Those present were asked to explain their international projects. Bruce reported on the well at Indor. By coincidence, another Club had a similar project and Dr. Agar-Wall of India, President of the Indor Rotary Club was also present, and expressed his appreciation of our efforts.

REMINISCING WITH FORD MOYNES

Hilt Brown brought Ford Moynes, our town historian and commentator to Monday's meeting. Our readers are all familiar with Ford's many contributions to Lindsay life. Ford took us on a ramble into Lindsay's colourful past. We heard of the Thomas Shoe Factory - the Board of Trade and Council were taken for \$17,000 - "but it was a bubble", says Ford.

The Great Counterfeit Money Scandal: Two enterprising men of the community contributed a new product to Lindsay industry. A gentleman of French extraction was engaged to "pass" the product. In North Bay this agent was arrested and eventually, he along with one of the local conspirators went to jail. Ford says a few lock worthies pulled some strings and "got off" one of the local men. Members present testified to the accuracy of Ford's account and volunteered that the actual plates were found later in a house in Lindsay.

The Great Bull Fights: Papers all over the continent publicized this Lindsay-boosting enterprise, involving Mexican bulls and Matadors. But the bulls got held up at Customs (could it be that some eminence gris arranged for this?) and by the time they got here they were a tired and sorry looking lot. But Lindsay had constructed a ring and so the fights were staged. The most exciting action was a hasty retreat by a member of the local constabulary. If any kind of publicity is good publicity, the scheme was not a total loss, we think.
