How many readers are aware that Lindsay once had thirteen hotels and a brewery, Cornell's, which was located on William Street North of the Horn Woolen Mill.

That the one time Sylvester binder and reaper was manufactured in a large foundry and factory at the corner of Kent Street and Victoria Ave.

That the Perrin boat works on Kent Street East manufactured the finest and best boats in Ontario.

That Sir Henry Pellet of Toronto owned a large brewery and distillery in the old stone mill on Kent Street East.

That the Squires fancy pea factory at Russell and Victoria Ave was one of the first in Ontario, operating during

the period of World War One. That when the Horn Woolen Mill was destroyed by fire in the days of World War One, many believed it was the work of German spies.

That the first Lindsay fair was held on the block surrounded by Kent and Russell and Sussex and Victoria Ave.

That the first baseball diamond was on the corner of Kent and Victoria where the public library now stands.

That the first fire hall was in the Tangney block on Kent Street.

That the first public library was above the present Dominion bank.

That the first printing plant of the Daily Post was at the foot of Kent Street, now Polito's Fruit Market.
