COMMERCIAL NEWS.

OFFICE OF THE CANADIAN POST, LINDRAY, August 16th, 1889. Suctuoss and Product.

Harvesting has progressed under the difficulty of tickle weather and with extra heavy work. Farmers are at it early and late. Despite some drawbacks there is a splendid return, and as the outlook for good prices is encouraging, better times The English harvest is believed to be

better than was anticipated, but stocks of Patrick O'Suidean, the Iceman, who is charged with complicity in the Comin ment, says the London Economist, we find the wheat crop good in the west and bad in the east, and as a whole "much smaller than that of last year." There is no doubt that the serious deficiency in Russia, Rou-mania and Hungary, and a poor yield in some of the most important districts of Austria and Italy, will leave the surplus in the experting countries of Europe a small one. To this there is one mitigation in the shape of large stocks of old wheat held in Russis, but their smount is not clearly known, save that it cannot make up the deficiency in the crop. Then the final official report of the Indian crop estimates the total yield at 6,465,000 tone against 7,148,000 last year, and 6,244,000 in 1887. There seems to be a decrease in every province except the Punjab. This falling off has made itself felt in decreased ship ments, which in the first sixteen weeks of the season were only 1,092,000 tons against 1,010,000 in the corresponding week la-t year. The States seems to be the only exporting country from which any increased separts can be expected in the comin rear: and even there the locreace will probably be reduced by the very small stocks carried over from last year's crop. Nor even there do prospects seem so fine as were some time since stated. The offiwhear crop to have suffered a further fall
