### The Back Country

The construction of the Victoria Bailway to Ifalibuiton, says the Intependent, and its absorption by the Midland, is opening up the whole of the back country to new modes of usefulness. The fact that a train leaves Toronto in the morning, and arrives in Haliburton within a few hours, has forced itself on the attention of the artizans of the provincial capital, and has induced several to buy farms in the back country where their wives and families permanently reside, they themselves working in Toronto during summer, and staying on their farms in winter. For masons, bricklayers, house. carpenters, and other work people whose ecupations can not be followed in winter, the back country affords an excellent mode of living cheaply and of profitably employing the periods of their enforced illeness. In the back country they can obtain a free grant of wild land, or they can go to the English company to buy land, and good land too, at fifty cents an acre, receiving the title deeds on the spot, and on the land thus obtained they can settle their families whilst they themwives work in Toronto as long as work is procurable. Usually all that such men can earn in summer is eaten up during winter, but when they own a farm in the back country the family more than maintains itself and the money earned in summer can be nearly all saved. In a B. D., Sub, Prior, etc. Jeromes P. R. C. few years they have a good farm, a comfortable independence and a sing house, everything pleasant around them. Several families are now settled in the back country under these circumstances and report most encouragingly of the re-sults. The example will probably be followed by hundreds of others.
