

Royal Canadian Insurance Co'y.

The report of the Royal Canadian just published shows an increase in premiums, assets, investments and reserves. The surplus as regards policy holders is now over half a million, not in premium notes, which no one expects to have to pay, but in hard cash. The report of the London Mutual not only shows a falling off is business, and a decrease in surplus, but it shows an increase in the losses, working expenses, money borrowed and interest paid, the item of borrowed money being increased from \$40,000 in 1889 to \$60,000 in 1890, and the item of interest from \$875 to \$2033.
