'I'ne Edgar Charges

Mr. J. D. Edgar, M.P. for West Ontario, has addressed a letter to Judges Tait and Routhier, the commissioners appointed to enquire into certain charges against Sir Adolphe Caron, made in Parliament by Mr. Edgar, in which he declines to take any part in the enquiry.

Mr. Edgar complains that his charges as
originally made in the House of Commons, were not accepted, but that their phraseology was changed in the resolution in amendment moved by Hon. Mr. Bowell and adopted by the House. On this point Mr. Edgar says:—

"In Mr. Bowell's charge 8, referring to the Quebec and Lake St. John Railway company, it is alleged that Sin Adolphe Caron received large sums of money for election purposes 'from said railway company' or 'from a construction com-

pany formed for the construction of the "I made ne such charge; I do not be-

lieve in its truth; and in a speech I expressly informed the House that the money was not obtained from the comAll advertisements from non-resident persons or

All advertisements from non-resident persons or panies, 'but from companies who were beneficially interested in said subsidies.'"

"Then in Mr. Bowell's charge 5, refer-

ring to the Temiseouata Railway company, it is alleged that the said Adolphe Caron diverted the said substdies by receiving large sums of money from the said company' and 'by obtaining the payment by the said company' of very large sums of money."

"Again I say, no such charge was ma'e by me, and the Government knew why I did not make 16." "In Mr. Bowell's No. 6, the same charge as to companies is repeated, because it speaks of the 'last mentioned

payments so obtained and made." "The assumed dealings with the rail way companies are again introduced in Mr. Bowell's charge No. 9, and in his final charge No. 10, a corrupt conspiracy is boldly charged to have existed between Sir Adolphe Caron and the said companies, or one or more of them; and this in spite of my distinct assertions to the

ontrary."
Mr. Edgar concludes by saying:-"Although I have been refused the investigation I demanded, and while I declined to take any part in this reference from the reasons stated, yet I take this occasion to make a public list of witnesses whom I would have called had I been given the opportunity to prove my charges, namely :- Sir Adolphe Caron, the secretary of the Quebec and Lake St. John Railway company, the secretary of the Temiscouata Railway company, Hon. Thos. McGreevy, J. J. Macdonald, J. Israel Tarte, Dr. Grandbois, M.P., A. B. Macdonald, H. J. Beemer, representatives of the estate of the late Hon. J. G Ruse; manager of the Quebec bank at Quebec, manager of the People's bank at Quebec. The following witness is also indicated : "In the Votes and Proceedings of the House of Commons of 10th June, 1892, on pages 489 to 506 inclusive in a notice of motion given by Sir Richard Cartwright, are to be found copies of l-tters, receipts and other documents, which seem to have a direct and essential relevancy to the charges which I made in the House of Commons. In case of fail ure to secure the production of the originals from Mr. Thomas McGreevy, I would have called upon Mr. John Alex ander, of the Engraving bureau, 16 Adelaide street west, Toronto, to produce and prove the photographic facsimiles thereof which he had executed."

EDITORIAL NOTES.

The Canadian-American of Chicago says: In our issue of the 12th we quoted the words of a Canadian M.P., who declared that 'the whole Yankee nation is disorganized." But the Sun's summing up of the situation must be accepted as a candid expression from patriotic sources that are disturbed over attacks on society by destructive forces that are aiming to produce anarchy in this country. In the words of the Sun, "society is forced to take up arms for its defense against anarchy."


