**The Lives of the Saints.**  
The largest work on one subject is the "Acta Sanctorum," or "Deeds of the Saints," most commonly called "Lives of the Saints." It was begun by the Bollandists, a community of the Society of Jesus. The first volume was completed in 1643. The subsequent volumes have altogether been issued. Other volumes are still in preparation.

**Trolley to the Pyramids.**  
One of the evils of the British occupation of Egypt is the introduction of modern inventions into the country in that ancient land. The "tramsways" in Cairo are run by electricity and a trolley line has been projected for a trolley line from Cairo to the Pyramids.

**Washing Flannels.**  
Flannels require care in their washing to prevent their shrinking and keep them soft. Make a strong sudsy water, and rub the flannels as if as the hand can bear it, put in the flannels, and let them lie twenty minutes. A flannel should not be rubbed, but drawn through the hands until it seems perfectly clean. Prepare another tub of water, not using quite so much soap, and when the flannels are taken out of the first water, dip them into the second water, press through it and put them into a warm water, slightly luke. Carefully wring them out and then hang them to shake them well and dry as quickly as possible, taking care not to hang them where there is a fire, when drying is wanted sufficiently dry. When the flannels and hang them unfolded until rolled up ~~when~~ dry and laid one side to be ironed later.
