The RCMP Musical Ride represents a colourful Canadian tradition. The troop of 32 horses and riders will perform a variety of cavalry drills choreographed to music. Working through a unique

The Musical Ride was developed in 1876 by early members of the North West Mounted Police to display their riding ability and entertain the local community. It

Members of the Musical Ride are first and foremost Police Officers. They all have at least 2 years experience in active police work before volunteering for duty with the Musical Ride. Surprisingly, most have no prior riding experience.

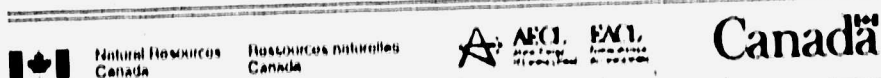
PROJECT INFORMATION EXCHANGE OPENS IN NEWCASTLE
