The announcing of the Dedication Services of the new Orono United Church for the third and fourth Sundays in July will no doubt add an encouraging note for everyone. Interest and concern for the building will be sharpened and the opening eagerly awaited. To mention that the opening services will be greatly received is no doubt an understatement.

The congregation of the Park Street United Church has awaited patiently the erection of the new edifice for almost a year and a half. During this time the St. Saviour's Anglican Church has made it possible to carry on regular Sunday morning worship in the desired atmosphere. Also the generosity of the Masonic Order has supplied class rooms for the Sunday School. Both of these organizations have played an important part in the continuance of worship in the community during this period of a year and a half. 
