## Does Your Machinery Pay

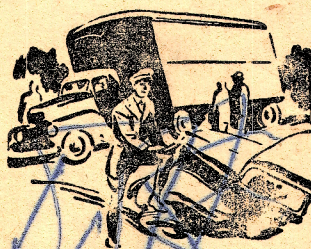
Power take-off forage harvesters and pick-up hay-balers cut time and labour requirements. But, they are a good investment for farmers only if their operational life can be extended to 2,000 hours.

Those are the conclusions reported by D. A. Brown of the Experimental Farm at Brandon, Man., following tests on the two types of machine.

Cost of operating the power take-off forage harvester, initial cost of which was \$1,250, was 98 cents a ton for green corn. Cost of operating the harvester, plus cost of tractor and operator was \$1.32 a ton.

It cost \$1.70 a ton to bale hay with the automatic pick-up hay baler, which had an initial cost of \$1,980. Total cost per ton of baler, tractor and operator was \$2.74.

To get profitable returns on the capital expended, the average operational span for the forage harvester should be from 100 to 120 hours a year and for the automatic hay baler from 140 to 170 hours a year, Mr. Brown says.

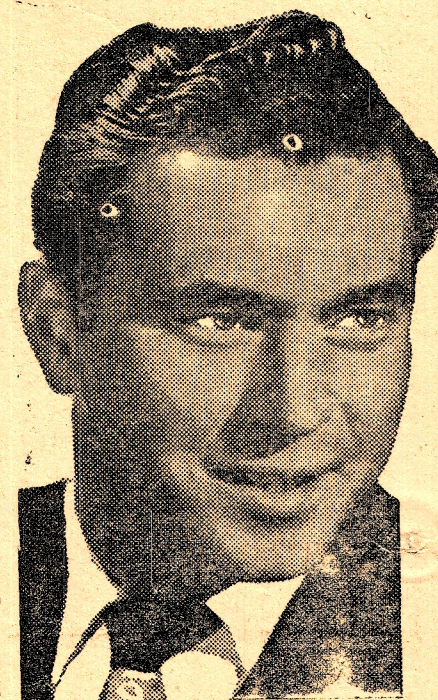

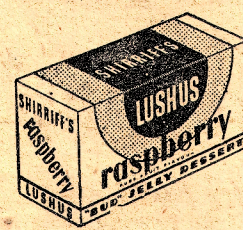

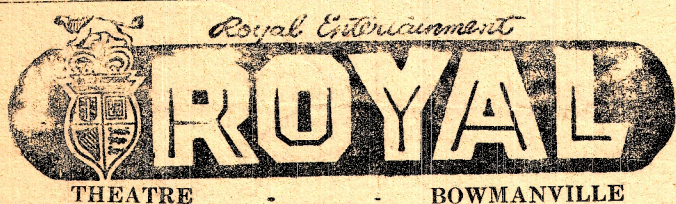
