THE WHITE ROSE OF COBOURG

By decree of Cobourg Municipal Council (September 25, 1972) the white rose became Cobourg's official floral emblem. It is a symbol of peace, brotherhood and fidelity.

COBOURG FACTS

LOCATION

Cobourg is located amidst rolling country on the north shore of Lake Ontario, 112 Km. east of Toronto and 145 Km. west of Kingston. Montreal is 435 Km. to the east.

Industrial centres close to Cobourg include Peterborough, 56 Km. north, Oshawa 64 Km. west and Belleville, 64 Km. east. Cobourg is thus centrally located in the Great Pine Ridge area in close proximity to industrial and commercial centres and yet ideally situated to provide recreational activities such as swimming, sailing, fishing, golfing and various winter sports. An ideal community in which to live, work and play.

CLIMATE

Moderate climate with cool breezes off the lake in the summer with an average minimum temperature of 14°C and a maximum of 26°C in July. The January temperature range varies from -9°C minimum to -1°C maximum. The annual rainfall averages 63.5 cm. and snowfall 165 cm. The bright sunshine hours for the year average 2020 hours. The area has a 130 day frost free period from mid-May to early October.

POPULATION

The 1984 population is 13,000.

EMPLOYMENT

Cobourg draws its work force from a large surrounding area and there is usually a good supply of male and female labour available.

Cobourg Canada Employment Centre (416 372-3326) covers a population area of 42,000 and maintains records on available skilled, semi-skilled and unskilled labour in the area. It also provides institutional and industrial training, youth service, job creation and employee clearance services. The Centre can be of assistance in job placement and training programs.

MUNICIPAL SERVICES

WATER - The town water supply is from Lake Ontario to a modern filtration plant.

Pressure of system - 75 lbs./square inch average

Pumping capacity - 5 MM per day

Average Consumption - 3.5 MM per day

There is underground storage for 1.25 million gallons and an elevated storage tank that holds 300,000 gallons. Planned expansion will increase pumping capacity to 8 million gallons per day.

GAS – Natural gas is supplied through Trans-Canada pipeline from Western Ontario and distributed in Cobourg by Northern & Central Gas Co. Limited.

Line size - 2-6"

Pressure - Residential 20 P.S.I.

- Industrial 150 P.S.I.

ELECTRICAL POWER – Cobourg is served by Ontario Hydro. **Availability:** Primary power is available at various voltages up to 44KV depending on the size and type of load. Industrial power rates are comparable with other towns in Central and Eastern Ontario.

SEWER – Primary and secondary treatment; overall capacity 4.8 million gallons per day.

Trunk Line - 36"

Feeder Lines - 21" and 30"

Industrial effluent subject to treatment in Plant before discharge into Town lines.

Residential – once a week

Downtown Commercial – twice a week

Other Commercial – Private Contract

FIRE PROTECTION

Fire protection is provided by a composite Fire Department, operating from Elgin Street East with a staff consisting of a full-time Fire Chief, Fire Prevention Officer, 8 full-time and 6 part-time Firefighters.

Fire department vehicles are modern and well equipped to provide fire protection and rescue/extrication services within the municipality.

The Fire Department also has an on-going and active fire prevention and training program, as well as providing inspection services to all occupancies within the municipality, including private residences upon request. Fire safety training is also available through regular courses conducted by fire department personnel.

POLICE PROTECTION

Headquarters building is situated near the centre of Town with a Chief, 1 staff sergeant, 4 sergeants and 14 constables. Cruisers patrol the town twenty-four hours a day. The Ontario Provincial Police Headquarters is a ½ km north of the Town of Cobourg.

TRANSPORTATION

RAIL – Canadian National and Canadian Pacific Railways serve Cobourg's needs for freight, express pick-up and daily delivery. A reciprocal switching agreement is in effect. There is rail service in and out of Northam Industrial Park, as well as at various other industrial sites. Additional siding switches are available if required.

Daily passenger service to and from Cobourg is by VIA Rail.

PASSENGER BUS SERVICE - Daily bus service is available to Montreal, Ottawa, Toronto, etc., via Voyageur Colonial Lines, and to Peterborough and Lindsay via Travelways, from the downtown terminal.

TOWN TRANSIT - The Municipality operates a public transit system providing hourly service to the major commercial, residential and industrial areas of Cobourg. Bus operates Monday to Friday, 7 a.m. to 6 p.m., year round, and on Saturdays, October 1 to April 30 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

TRANSIT SERVICE FOR THE DISABLED - Wheels Incorporated, a radio dispatched mobility bus, equipped with automatic lifts for wheelchairs, operates 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday (excluding holidays). Call 372-2288 to register.

TRUCK TRANSPORTATION - Extensive direct service to points in Ontario, Quebec, the U.S.A., with connecting carriers for overseas shipments. There are several truck terminals in Cobourg and a sufferance warehouse. Truck service is available for points from Halifax to Vancouver.

ROADS - The Macdonald-Cartier Freeway (Highway 401) borders the town with 2 access roads into Cobourg providing direct routes to Toronto, Windsor, Montreal and the American interstate highway system. The scenic Highway 2 (Heritage Highway) runs east and west through the town while Highway 45 runs north from it to Ottawa.

AIR SERVICES - Air service to Toronto, Ottawa, Montreal and the Maritimes is available at the Peterborough Airport (48 km).

To Pearson International Airport, Toronto, there is bus service twice daily from Cobourg and limousine service by request.

CUSTOMS FACILITIES - Customs and Excise Offices. serving the town and surrounding area, are located in the Federal Building, 39 Queen Street.

Customs clearances for Marine Services are located at the Cobourg Marina.

HARBOUR - Cobourg harbour, situated on the north shore of Lake Ontario, is a recreational harbour for pleasure craft only. Ideally located for boaters, it is only 2 blocks from the heart of downtown and within walking distance to shopping, churches, park, liquor store, banks, theatre, swimming, etc.

Facilities: There are 150 slips, including 75 with hydro and water. The marina contains showers, washroom, laundry facilities, tourist information and customs clearance. Fuel and sewage pumpout are available. Boat launching ramp access is via Hibernia Street.

RECREATION AND ORGANIZATIONS

SPORTS - Cobourg is situated on the north shore of Lake Ontario, just south of Rice Lake and the Trent Canal System, in beautiful Northumberland County. The environment and terrain provide unlimited recreational opportunities.

Four golf courses are easily accessible. Other facilities include, curling, boating, swimming, skating, snowmobiling, hunting, fishing, hiking, crosscountry and downhill skiing, bowling, badminton, tennis, squash, lawn bowling, hockey, football, baseball, basketball, soccer, judo, miniature golf, karate, wheelchair basketball, Tae Kwon Do, figure skating, blind bowling etc.

The Quench Run (5 & 10 km) is held on the 3rd Saturday in August annually, Cobourg has a Junior C hockey team, "The Cougars".

The Highland Games is another annual event – always the first Saturday in July in Donegan Park.

PARKS – There are nine parks, including one conservation area park and one campground, within the Town.

ARENAS - Cobourg's two arenas, situated on the same lot, in a central location, are in use year round with skating or roller skating.

FITNESS CENTRE - Cobourg Fitness Centre, run by the Family Y, has an indoor pool, sauna, squash court, swimming and fitness programs.

HIKING – 1.2 mile trail created by Rotary Club and marked with yellow and brown "Cobourg Trail" signs, starts at Rotary Park on William Street and ends on Tay Street at Lake Ontario.

CULTURAL ACTIVITIES - Cobourg Public Library serves the community. The Art Gallery of Northumberland has a collection of Canadian and European works and change their exhibits monthly. Cobourg Art Club provides art instruction and an annual spring exhibition. The Cobourg Opera and Drama Guild sponsors the White Rose Concert Series of fine arts music. The Northumberland Orchestra Society presents The Symphony Orchestra. The Philharmonic Choir and The String Ensemble feature a concert series. The Concert Band of Cobourg provides outstanding regular entertainment. Northumberland Players amateur theatre group stage plays and dinner theatres while the Town Hall Theatre provides professional summer theatre. The Oriana Singers, Sweet Adelines and Pine Ridge Chorus Barber Shop Quartet entertain periodically. Local Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee (LACAC) advises the Town on preservation of architectural and historically important buildings. The Historical Society creates interest and promotes local area history. The Heritage Association protects, preserves and promotes the historical, cultural, natural and architectural environment of the area.

INDUSTRY

Cobourg maintains a good growth balance between commercial business, services and industry. The downtown business section has been progressively renovated and growth has extended to two small shopping centres on the outskirts. Studies for orderly growth and expansion are under way.

Cobourg Industry employs over 2,500 persons in some forty manufacturing facilities varying in size from three to seven hundred employees.

COBOURG INDUSTRIAL GROWTH

Poised for the 80s, Cobourg continues its redevelopment from the inside out. In meeting the challenge of the new technologies, 53.4% of our existing industries are currently upgrading their production techniques (40.6%) and, office automation technologies (43.8%). All of them reporting above average to excellent productivity.

ROOM TO GROW

We have approximately 2,000 acres of designated industrial lands and we maintain an inventory of about 450,000 square feet of industrial space. Matched to these inventories, are state-of-the-art services for water and sewage treatment.

The labour environment is very stable with an average of only 4% turnover and a local persistency of around 25 years for the age of our companies.

Transportation via Road, Rail and International Seaway access within less than 1 hour's trucking gives us a prime location from which to access a full 50% of North America's population, all within one day's trucking.

The local market generates well in excess of \$100,000,000. annually with plastics, chemicals, food, metals and machinery being the most prominent industrial skills in the area.

When all this is added to a go-ahead life style and one of the most opulent histories on the north shore, it's not difficult to see the justifiable optimism of Cobourg.

Sir Sandford Fleming College maintains a Lakeshore Office in Cobourg which offers continuing education programs with courses in word processing and microcomputer programming taught in their computer lab here.

A variety of night school courses are offered by the high schools and Sir Sandford Fleming College in the two high schools.

The elementary schools provide the important basic foundations of education and the secondary schools offer a wide range of academic, technical trades and commercial courses. School shop facilities provide courses in electronics, machine shop, auto mechanics, carpentry, etc.

HOUSING

Cobourg maintains a good residential balance between private homes and apartments. There are approximately 650 rental units in medium size apartments of 20-50 units in each and about 250 units in smaller size apartments of 6 to 20 units. New housing starts average approximately 50 per year. There are also many small residential communities close to Cobourg. New subdivision of single and multiple family dwellings are continuously being proposed. The many realty firms in the area are ready to serve the needs of the community.

Golden Plough Lodge, 169 bed capacity Home for the Aged is also located in Cobourg.

Windermere Place, a recent 71 unit senior citizens apartments.

St. Peter's Court also provides housing for senior citizens. Legion Village, a new 126 unit apartment building for senior citizens.

The Town Council, through its planning consultants, maintains an on-going up-to-the minute study of local housing requirements.
