Welcome to Cobourg

Cobourg, Northumberland's County seat is a vibrant and historic community located about an hour's drive east of Toronto. Situated on a sandy stretch of Lake Ontario with the rolling hills of Northumberland providing a majestic backdrop, this charming town has so much to offer.

Founded in 1798, the first settlers were United Empire Loyalists. Around 1804, the settlement was made the capital of the Newcastle District (later renamed the United Counties of Northumberland and Durham).

The town grew as more settlers arrived, particularly after the war of 1812, when immigrants of means such as pay officers moved into the area. Grist mills and saw mills, stores and residences sprang up as Cobourg evolved out of its pioneer state into a bustling community.

By the 1840s, the population had grown to over 4,300 people. During this time, Cobourg became a major economic and social centre. Money was invested in roads, harbour and other facilities. In 1834, Cobourg received a charter to build a railway, only a few years after the world's first railway was opened.

By 1850, Cobourg was the fifth largest centre in the province with a population of over 5,000 people.

During the 1850s, the Cobourg to Peterborough Railway opened and Cobourg's residents believed that the town was destined to become the capital of the province. They decided to construct Victoria Hall, a grand civic building to reflect the town's future importance.

Unfortunately, the heady spirit of prosperity was not to last. A widespread depression, the failure of the railway and the high cost of the construction of Victoria Hall, brought the town to the brink of bankruptcy.

The town's population dwindled. However, within a few short years Cobourg rose again and became a fashionable summer resort. Throughout North America, it was advertised that Cobourg air had the second highest ozone content in the world. Ozone was then considered very salubrious to one's health. Soon the well-to-do were coming from all over North America as far away as New Orleans and St. Louis to summer in Cobourg.

By 1900, Cobourg was the most popular summer resort in Canada with over 2,000 summer residents, many of whom built homes here, some on a palatial scale. The town became known as the "Newport of the North". Today, more than ever, Cobourg continues to be a popular tourist destination. After World War Two, a renewal began and since then the population has more than tripled. Today majestic treelined streets, handsome historic buildings, Heritage Harbour and beautiful Victoria Park provide a perfect backdrop to the multitude of activities found in this charming town.

Cobourg's CN Railway Station

Built around 1900 by the Grand Trunk Railway, the original building stood in the exact spot where the newly renovated Via Station now stands. It has been restored to its original romanesque revival architectural style and includes features such as a 15 foot high tongue and grooved wood ceiling, lead pane fan windows and wainscotting. Taken over by Via in 1986, it has been made wheelchair accessible and brought up-to-date for today's building and fire codes, while still retaining the original colour and architectural style. What visitors will see is a modern version of useful and solid architecture as presented by Corporate Via during the reopening celebrations of November 1992.



Victoria College was opened in 1836 as Upper Canada Academy by the Methodist Church. In 1841, it was renamed Victoria College and given the power to grant degrees. Reverend Egerton Ryerson, the founder of Ontario's educational system became its first president. In 1833, Augusta Stowe, the first Ontario trained female doctor graduated from the university which specialized in medicine, arts and sciences. In 1892, the university moved to Toronto and became part of the University of Toronto.

Victoria College is now privately owned and not open to the public.

LACAC'S Historical Walking Tour

Cobourg's Local Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee has produced a walking tour of Cobourg featuring information on a number of the town's historic buildings. In pamphlet form, it is available at the Chamber of Commerce or at Victoria Hall.

Marie Dressler House

This charming Ontario-style cottage, birthplace of 1920s film star Marie Dressler, has attracted visitors to Cobourg for many years.

Christened Leila Marie von Koerber, Marie Dressler was the youngest of two sisters. Her father was organist at St. Peter's Church. She used to say she knew she would never be a great beauty, so she decided to make people laugh. This she certainly did, in such movies as "Tillie's Tomato Surprise" in 1915 and "Tillie the Scrub Lady" in 1917. Marie was best known for her leading role in "Tugboat Annie" in 1933 and her Oscar winning role in "Min and Bill" in 1930.



Dressler House, which used to be a restaurant, was recently restored and renovated and is now the home of the Cobourg and District Chamber of Commerce, featuring a tourist information centre and a Dressler memorabilia collection including life size wax figures depicting Marie Dressler and Wallace Beery on the set of "Min and Bill".

Victoria Hall

Cobourg's magnificent civic building located on King Street, is physically and spiritually the heart of the town. Its impressive clock tower dominates the local skyline. "The Grand Old Lady of King Street" as Victoria Hall is affectionately called, was designed by the well-known architect, Kivas Tully, and construction began in 1856. Four years later, it opened with a grand ball presided over by the Prince of Wales, who

later became Edward VII. In the early 1970s, it had become apparent that the building was in desperate need of repair. A 6.2 million dollar restoration program lasting until 1983, was undertaken. Today, Victoria Hall, a declared national

historic monument, stands as one of the finest buildings in Canada. Guided tours are offered during the summer or a special tour can be arranged through the Chamber of Commerce at (905) 372-5831.

Victoria Hall boasts 41 rooms including the elegant concert hall and the "Old Bailey Court Room", both featuring elaborately painted "Trompe l'oeuil" walls and ceilings. The Concert Hall regularly features performances by the local orchestra and amateur theatre groups. To contact the box office call (905) 372-2210.

The ART GALLERY OF NORTHUMBERLAND, located on the third floor is designated as a national exhibition centre. Municipal offices are also housed within Victoria Hall.



Historic Downtown

King Street is one of Ontario's finest remaining historic main streets. Largely intact, the buildings date from the early 1830s to the early 1900s.

In recent years, trees, heritage lamp standards and flower baskets have been introduced to enhance the area.

The street is characterized with large three story brick buildings with ornate cornices and window treatments.

Several events are held annually in the downtown area, including the sidewalk sale and Carnival Mall and the Cobourg First Night New Year's Eve celebration.

Visitors to Cobourg will enjoy the bustling Farmers Market which has been a part of the Cobourg tradition since 1850.

The market runs from 7:00 am till 12:00 noon each Saturday, May to October.

Cobourg's Waterfront/Victoria Park

Victoria Park, in addition to its natural beauty, offers an amazing array of activities for visitors of all ages. A children's playground and splash pad, a kiddies wading pool, an outdoor swimming pool with high diving board and of course the magnificent quarter mile stretch of white sand beach, which Cobourg is so fortunate to possess.

Activities in the park include mini golf, summer concerts by the Concert Band of Cobourg, baseball and the Lawn Bowling Club of Cobourg which was formed in 1907.

Victoria Park is also the venue for many community events and festivals including the annual Cobourg Waterfront Festival, which attracts thousands of visitors each year. Held over the July 1 weekend, this three-day event features Canada Day celebrations, entertainment, arts and crafts and an artists show and sale.





Waterfront / Victoria Park Cont'd

Cobourg's "pride and joy" is the Waterfront Promenade. Linking the Heritage Harbour, campground and Victoria Park by a path of mellow brick paving, the walkway stretches two miles along the waterfront to the marina building. Beautifully landscaped with trees and shrubbery, park benches and heritage lamp standards displaying banners and flower baskets, the promenade is punctuated with charming pergolas. The combined effect of landscaping and magnificent views, creates an extremely pleasant walk. It is no wonder that this is a popular spot for locals and visitors to take a stroll.

Floral Clock

Located in Victoria Park is the beautiful Rotary Floral Clock. It was donated by the Rotary Club to commemorate their 60th Anniversary. Each year a different theme design is featured. The clock is 30 feet in diameter and contains approximately 3,000 plants,



Heritage Harbour




Located in the centre of Cobourg directly behind Victoria Hall, Cobourg's harbour is one of the oldest and finest on the north shore of Lake Ontario. Begun in 1829, the present shape and size was completed by the mid 1840s. Once it was a major industrial and commercial harbour which saw thousands of newly arriving immigrants, tons of lumber, wood, grain and coal pass through its mouth each year. The harbour has been reborn in recent years into one of the finest pleasure berths on Lake Ontario. Containing 197 docks and the best service building on Lake Ontario, Heritage Harbour can offer visiting sailors every convenience including washrooms, showers, laundromat, ice, pump-out, gas and diesel fuel. In addition, 20 amp power, telephones and a picnic area with tables and charcoal barbecues are all provided.

For boaters' added convenience, the Cobourg and District Chamber of Commerce supplies visitor information and Cobourg Souvenirs at the marina office. Bicycles are available free of charge to visiting boaters who would like to tour the town and main shopping area, just two blocks away. All provisions, including marine store, pharmacies, liquor store and wide-range of gift shops and restaurants are within short walking distance.

Campgrounds


