a 'Manual Training School' at the Four Corners' I notice little is known of it and as my father and mother both attended the school in their 'teens they frequently reminisced

The promoter and headmaster was an American, one Mr. Fay, who succeeded in arousing sufficient interest among the pioneer heads of familles, to have a working directorate formed, with the result that a large building, with some land attached, was built on the site of where now stands the residence of Mr. J. G. Waite.

With its two large dormitories, dining room, chass rooms, office, etc. the plan evidently in the beginning was warble fly to found an institution bearing simiies' Clerk, larity to a present day agricultural college. 


