

William A. Weir and Violet (Balls) Weir

William Andrew was the eldest son of John and Euphemia Weir, and was born at Mar.

He enlisted in the First World War on March 9 th. 1916 and went overseas October 3 rd. that same year. He arrived home May 19 th. 1919.

In 1920 he and his brother Archie bought their parents' farm, Lot 23 Con 1 EBR, when the parents relocated.

In 1927 William married Violet Balls of Adamsville. In 1935 they bought the farm across the road, Lot 22 Con 1 EBR, and moved there.

They farmed and made considerable improvements to their house, barn and out buildings.

William was Patrolman for Albemarle Township from 1927-1939. He also served on the Council and was Reeve from 1940-1942. In 1942 he was appointed Road Superintendent for the four northern townships of St. Edmunds, Lindsay, Eastnor and Albemarle. He retired in 1966.

Mr. and Mrs. Weir were both active in the Presbyterian Church and in community activities. Mr. Weir served a Church Manager and Elder. Mrs. Weir supplied as organist and was a member of the Women's Institute.
