They made additions to the house Mrs Bartley was a gardener worker a good builder and carpenter and drew beautiful <sup>& imaginative</sup> designs for the lovely rugs and quilts his wife made. He made nice lawn and tree plantings Their flowers were lovely He remembers his wife's name Laura spelled out across the front of the lawn facing the highway in cream irises. He was the mail man from Mar to Red Bay for many years. His wife seldom went anywhere except drive to Red Bay & later not still after his death she became a complete recluse.

Harvey Weir bought the farm, and sold the front of the lot to Mr & Mrs Pierce Hiltz who keep it all so beautifully. behind them are the Oliver Pappas and next the Clymer Moores.

In 1905 March 4 Mr J. Crane <sup>Martha Jane Crane</sup> sold the homestead S. Lot 21 N. Lot 22 to son Archibald for \$4000 Their children Josephine and Tom were born here and Mrs Archie Crane was a charter member of the Womens Institute. The couple took a leading part in the building of the Baptist Church. Mrs Crane gave music lessons boarded the teacher Archie a lovely tenor voice and it was a real loss to Mar. when Mrs Cranes health necessitated their moving to Owen Sound &
