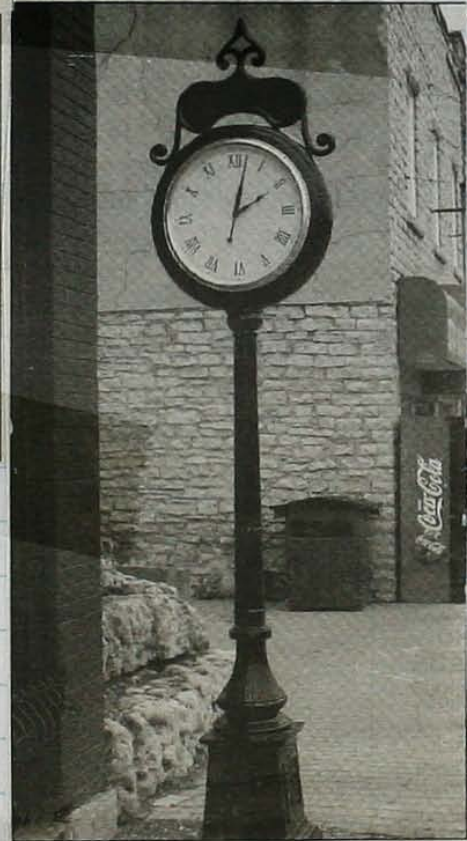




CORNERSTONE BACK IN PLACE — Keith Gilbert/ Wiarion Echo

A LARGE 350 lb cornerstone and a time capsule that had been part of the Oliphant W.I. Hall for 100 years was finally given a new resting place last week. The stone had been carefully removed when the W.I. and the Oliphant Young At Heart Seniors decided to build a new entrance to the former school. With a grant from the Trillium Foundation, building started last fall. The time capsule contained a number of items, including an 1905 Echo, Home and Country, and other papers. The building committee added a few new items to the capsule and it was put in with the cornerstone. The attractive front entrance was finished in stone donated by Carl Barfoot from his quarry.
