

Nov. 1st, 1917 - Letter from Red Cross Society read and discussed. Motion carried that the matter of funds or work for Red Cross be left over till after Christmas.

Dec. 7th, 1917 - Mrs. Bolton, President of North Bruce W.I. gave a very helpful and interesting address regarding Red Cross work etc. A Red Cross Society in connection with the Institute was discussed. Motion passed that a meeting be held in the church on the first Tuesday to make arrangements for same.

April 7th, 1918 - Letter read from Red Cross Society acknowledging the receipt of socks. Motion carried that each member sell her own junk this year and give money to the Red Cross.

May 2nd, 1918 - \$15 was donated to the Y.M.C.A. at the Front.

June 8th 1918 - \$1 received for proceeds sale of junk. Roll Call.

"War Time Recipe"

July 4th, 1918 - Debate was given, entitled, "Resolved that we should not read, study music, or do any needle work that will not help our boys in France". Motion passed to accept material donated by Red Cross Society for the making of quilts, garments etc. for Belgian Relief.

Ways of making money for Red Cross were discussed

Aug. 8th, 1918 - Committees were appointed to look after the cutting of garments and distributing the work for the West 3, and the East 3. The Institute and the Red Cross were asked to go together and get up the supper for Civic Holiday. Motion passed to do so. Three men were named as a committee for the program. Any other arrangements to be made at next Red Cross meeting.

Sept 5th, 1918 - Sewing for Belgian Relief was distributed.

Oct 3rd, 1918 - Motion passed that we donate \$30 of the
