Mrs. J. Warmington Dies At Warton In Her 98th Year

ALLENFORD — Mrs. Joseph Warmington, an Allenford resident for five years, died in the Bruce Peninsula and District Memorial Hospital, Warton, Friday, after being a patient there since Monday. She was in her 98th year.

Mrs. Warmington, formerly Celina Greaves, a daughter of the late Edward and Mary Greaves, was born in Elderslie township on Dec. 10, 1866.

Mrs. Warmington attended public school at No. 15 Bruce township, high school at Walkerton and later attended Ottawa Normal school. Following graduation she taught school for a number of years in Bruce county.

In Dec. 1863 she married Mr. Warmington of Amabel township. He predeceased her in November of 1931. Since her marriage, Mrs. Warmington lived on an Amabel township farm until moving to Allenford in 1959.

Mrs. Warmington was a member of the Methodist Church, then later the United Church of Park Head and Allenford. She taught Sunday School and was secretary of the UFO for a number of years.

Surviving are three sons, Lorne, Allenford, Leslie, Toronto and Percy, Owen Sound, three daughters, Emma, Marie, Mrs. Mac McDonald and Edna, Mrs. I. R. Wade, all of Allenford, 22 grandchildren and 45 great grandchildren. She was the last member of a family of eight. She was predeceased by one son, Russell.
