## MRS. W. P. BROOKS PASSES SUDDENLY ALONE IN HER HOME

Mrs. W. P. Brooks, well known Owen Sound resident, and formerly a resident of Park Head where her husband was C.N.R. agent for years, was found dead in her home at 211-5th Street East early Monday evening.

Mrs. Brooks, who lived alone following the death of her husband three years ago, is believed to have died of a sudden heart seizure sometime Saturday evening. Neighbors, becoming concerned as they saw no sign of her about the house, investigated and found her dead in the kitchen of her home, her fur coat nearby as if she had just come in and had suddenly been taken ill. Mrs. Stanley Rourke had been talking to her on the phone about 5 p.m. Saturday.

Held in deep regard a wide circle of friends both in the city and throughout the surrounding district, her death comes as a shock. She had been about the house and out of doors throughout Saturday apparently in good health. The deceased was a member of the Central United Church and a member of the Eastern Star. Though of a quiet, retiring nature, she had a faculty of making friends. She was deeply interested in her home and gardens on the upper Sydenham River, while her home at Park Head had been well known as a beauty spot of the district.

The late Mrs. Brooks was the former Elizabeth Leung. Thirty-three years ago she married William Brooks who died three years ago.

There were no children and she is survived by her brother Gordon Young of Windsor.

Mrs. Mustard is survived by four sons, Ernest of Shallow Lake, Irwin of Winnipeg, Russell of Toronto and George of Port Colborne; two daughters, Reta, Mrs. Andrew Schihl of Park Head and Alice, Mrs. John Murray of Toronto. There are 15 grandchildren and 25 great grandchildren.

She was predeceased by one daughter Elsie, seven brothers and three sisters.

Mrs. Mustard was a member of the Park Head United Church and a life member of the Women's Missionary Society.

## Mrs. J. Longmire Amabel Pioneer, Passes on Sunday

**PARK HEAD**—A woman who moved to Park Head over 90 years ago as a little girl with her father and mother, pioneer settlers of Amabel, Mrs. Anne Elizabeth Longmire, died at her home here on Sunday in her 95th year. Among her survivors are four great-great-grandchildren.

Mrs. Longmire had been ill for only three weeks. Until the day before her death she was bright and cheery and knew her neighbors. She was always known as a good neighbor.

Born in 1857 in Goderich, Mrs. Longmire moved to Park Head as a child with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Henry Lewis. At the age of 18 she married William Ross and two sons were born of the marriage, Will and Harry. Will was drowned when the steamer Jones went down in a storm in 1906. Harry lives in Park Head.

In 1894 she married James Longmire and the couple continued to live in Park Head. Mr. Longmire was a former sectionman with the C.N.R.

Mrs. Longmire was a member of the United Church and took an active part, in former days, in the village Women's Institute.

Surviving are her husband, son Harry, one brother Walter of Saskatchewan, five grandchildren, nine great-grandchildren, and four great-great-grandchildren.

She was predeceased by three brothers and three sisters. One brother Harry of Vancouver, and one sister, Miss Frances Lewis of Los Angeles, both lived to be over 100 years old. 1953
