Park Head child dies

A four year old Park Head boy was found dead by firemen, following a fire in a two-storey farmhouse Friday afternoon.

Brodie Souliere, son of James and Deborah Souliere was found by firefighters under the bed in an upstairs bedroom after they had brought the fire under control.

A post mortem, conducted by Dr. Kenneth MacNay of Wiarion showed the boy had died of asphyxiation. The boy's mother and two-year-old sister, who were also in the house at the time of the fire, were not hurt.

Police said the Amabel Township Fire Department were called about 2 p.m. and were able to quickly bring the fire under control. The cause of the fire has not been determined but it is believed to have begun in the area of an airtight woodstove, police said.

There was extensive damage throughout the house and the back kitchen was destroyed. A representative of the Ontario Fire Marshal's office will investigate the blaze.
