

1917 Obituary of Mrs. William Wall
from Anna Morgan's Scrapbook

Maria Morgan Wall was born at Ottawa, in Carleton Place, March 26, 1837 and died at her home in Niles, Kansas, January 22, 1917 at the age of 79 years, 9 months and 27 days. When a child she moved with her parents to Middlesex County, Ont. and lived on a farm where the town of Lucan now stands. Here she lived until 1853, going from there to Bruce County.

On September 30, 1857, she was united in marriage to William Wall. To this union were born nine children, six daughters and three sons, two of whom predeceased their mother on death, a son, Imm and a daughter, Mrs. Rozella Kearse. Those left to mourn the loss of a wife and mother are the husband, Wm. Wall; Mrs. Ellen Heywood of Manitoba; Mrs. May Skaggs of Salina; Mrs. Maud Davidson of Solomon; Uriah Wall of Toronto; Mrs. M.W. Armour, Mrs. Emma Boyle and Levi Boyle all of Niles, Kansas.

In 1882, she with her husband and family moved to Dakota where they lived for nine years. In 1891, they family moved to Niles, Kansas, where the family home has been for the last twenty-five years.

While in Canada, Mrs. Wall was a member of the Church of England and since going to the United States she has been a member of the Episcopal church. Mrs. Wall was the last of 12 children.

Pallbearers were her grandsons- Levi, William, John and Charles Armour, Ellsworth Boyle and Oscar Davidson. Buried in Greenville Cemetery at Niles, Kansas.

William and Maria's son, Uriah Wall died at his home, 990 Gerrard St. Toronto in his seventy-fifth year in 1939. Born near Ripley on March 16, 1865. He was their second son. He was married on ~~March 16~~ Jan. 22 1896 to Sadie Alexander, who survives, also one son son Walter A. Wall; One brother, Levi Wall and two sisters, Mrs. Mae Skaggs and Mrs. Maud Davidson live in the state of Kansas.

Walter A. Wall died in 1958. He was director of Intercity Securities Corporation Ltd. He was born in Kansas and came to Toronto as a youth. He had been active in the investment business for 35 years. Survived by widow Isabelle and two sons- Jack and Bill. Buried at St. John's, Norway.
