WALTER GOOD

The death of Walter Good of Vancouver , formerly of Lenore , occurred May 25 in Shaughnessy Military Hospital in Vancouver, in his 98th year. Mr. Good was the last of a family of 11, born near Kincardine, going to Manitoba, he settled in the Lenore district. Walter and his brother Thomas , operated the earliest blacksmith shop in Lenore. He served as a blacksmith overseas in the First World War. He is survived by a son , Marvin , and daughter-in-law, Lillian of Vancouver, and many nieces and nephews.



Mrs. Ida May Oliver of 400 E. 25th St., Cheyenne, Wyoming, U.S.A. died November 18, 1970 in Eventide of Sheridan, Wyoming.

Mrs. Oliver, the former Ida May Stanley, was born May 24, 1879 at Purple Grove, Ontario.

She graduated as a Registered Nurse from St. John's Hospital, Cheyenne, Wyoming, U.S.A.

Mrs. Oliver enlisted in the American Army Nursing Corps in 1917 and spent 16 months in American Base Hospital in France. After discharge from the Army she served as Superintendent of the Wyoming General Hospital at Rock Springs for five years. She was active in Girl Scouts, the Y.W.C.A. and was president of the Wyoming State Nurses Association for several years.

Mrs. Oliver was a member of St. Mark's Episcopal Church, Order of Eastern Star, P.E.O. and the Womens' Club.

She was a Past President of Chapter S. P.E.O. and a Charter Member and Past President of Chapter L. of P.E.O. at Rock Springs. She helped organize Chapter R. P.E.O. at Wheatland, Wyoming.

Mrs. Oliver also was secretary of the Red Cross for several years.

She is survived by one daughter (Thelma) Mrs. Rodger S. Bent of Sheridan, two granddaughters and one grandson, a brother Harry Stanley of Ripley and eight nieces and nephews.

Mrs. Oliver was preceded in death by her husband Edward M. Oliver.
