JOHN GLASS

John Glass came to Can. when a child of 6-7 with his parents and family from north of Belfast, Ireland & settled in Hastings in an Irish settlement.

Came to Huron Tp. with others in family, then to Lot 4, Conc. 2, Kinc. Took out Crown Deed Mar. 25/62.

John mar. Jane Bird, dau. of John Bird of next lot, Lot 3, an Englishman. Had 7 children on this lot (4) and 3 more on the South Line.

1. John Henry, eldest, mar. Miss Colwell of South Line. Was thresher - went West with bro. Robert to N. Dakota. His steam engine exploded & killed him.

2. Robert mar. Maria Colwell (sis. of John's wife), on Mar. 26, 1859 in Walkerton. (This record does not fit in. Year must be incorrect) Maria died in Dakota where John & Robert went. Robert came home to Tiverton later & mar. Mary MacLaurin, an old neighbour on the Boundary Lot 6/1 Bruce Tp. Robert & a friend called Kerr went from Dakota up to new part of Sask. and when the railroad came through, they called their settlement Kerrobert.

3. Irwin mar. a Southampton woman. Became Methodist missionary amongst Cree Indians of Alberta near Port Albert.

4. James went to Nevada & d. young there.

5. Mary mar. Hugh P. McEwen of Tiverton. She d. when youngest of 4 children a baby. It was raised by its grandmother, Mrs. John Glass.

5. Eliza Jane mar. Sam Burwash of Lot 5/4, Bruce & they lived on Lot 6/5 Bruce.
