

1914

F. H. Johnston was appointed Secretary-Treasurer.

1929

At a public meeting it was decided to clean up the cemetery and re-fence it and keep the weeds cut. George Piassetzki was appointed the first part-time caretaker.

1938

The first annual decoration day service was held on the first Sunday in August. It was held in the grove adjacent to the old cemetery.

1939

The first full-time caretaker Mr. Harry Bennett was engaged at 20¢ per hour.

1946

Andy Johnston was appointed Secretary-Treasurer making it the fourth generation of Johnstons to be secretary-treasurer of the Horton Cemetery.

The Cemetery was taken care of by donations of one dollar per lot per year as well as collections on decoration day.

The caretaker was Mr. George Piassetzki.

1956

All lots sold after this date had to include a perpetual care fee. This fee to be invested with the Public Trustee in Toronto. The interest from this fund was then sent back to the cemetery Board each year to pay for the upkeep of the cemetery.

1965

Andy Johnston passed away and Leith Collins was appointed Secretary-Treasurer of the cemetery and Carl Humphries replaced Andy Johnston as Chairman.

1967

George Piassetzki resigned as caretaker of the cemetery after many years of service. Dave Bennett Sr. was appointed caretaker.

1968

Carl Humphries resigned as chairman and Norman Eady was appointed to replace Mr. Humphries.
