

Oct., 11, 1857, Maria Janette (Payne) at Bytown, Ont.

May 2, 1862, Henry born in Horton Township.

April 28, 1866, Lousia (McNab) Horton Township.

June 18, 1869, Susan Ada in Horton Township.

Henry Finan was one of Renfrew's first photographers.

The Finan's eldest daughter Mary Ann married David Price a native of Combermere, farmer, and they carried on the farm work for a few year and then moved to part of lot 20, where they lived the remainder of their lives.

After Mrs. Finan's death the youngest son George and his wife received ownership of farm on March 10th, 1903. On 23rd of Feb. 1905.

George Finan and his wife Annie L. McTavish moved to Saskatchewan and sold to Robert R. Eady son of Wm. B. Eady of Horton, and his wife Susan (Price) Eady, a daughter of Mr. and David Price.

Except for 6 years spent in Alice Township, Robert and Susan spent a lifetime in Horton. Their family consisted of 5 sons and 3 daughters.

The eldest served in the 1rst Great War 1914-1918. A second son Murray met accidental death in Horton. Flora (Mrs. James Mullen) died in 1930 and Russell died in 1963.

Robert R. Eady met accidental death in 1910 and his wife later married Alonzo Wright a native of Denbigh.

General farming has been carried on the farm and in spite of advanced age the original house is still being used. It was of log construction with roughcast finish. The North Horton Telephone Co. installed the first telephones in the area in 1916. Electricity was installed in 1957.
